- Respiratory viruses in cattle: what's new?: Everyone knows about IBR and BRSV, so this talk will review other viruses that can contribute to BRD in cattle.
- Antimicrobial resistance in bovine respiratory disease: Historically, antimicrobial resistance did not appear to be a problem in bacteria that contribute to BRD, but evidence that things are changing will be presented.
