Glacier County veterinarian Barr Gustafson, DVM, assumes MVMA presidency

Glacier County veterinarian Dr. Barr Gustafson was recently named president of the Montana Veterinary Medical Association for the 2025-2026 term. Dr. Gustafson succeeds Linda Kauffman, DVM, of Stevensville, who will now serve as past president on the MVMA Executive Board.

Dr. Gustafson was born and raised in Conrad, and as a youngster traveled the backroads of north central Montana with his veterinarian father. He developed a liking for assisting animals in distress, and considered interacting with the diverse and interesting group of animal owners an added bonus.

A 1985 graduate of the Oregon State University College of Veterinary Medicine, Dr. Gustafson has been practicing in Glacier County since 1990.
